A CHILD FOUND DEAD ON A TURKEY BEACH BECOMES SYMBOL OF THE MIGRANTS CRISIS

Several newspapers around the world published the assembly of some of this photo to warn about the seriousness of the crisis of migrants. The impact of this photo is a warning.

Later this summer, boats frustrate several resumption of hundreds of migrants on the island of Kos in Greece, in front of stunned tourists came to the island on vacation. Culture shock is here in the injustice of this and ironically, that while some take advantage of the sea for them to relax their year of work, others less fortunate derive towards this promised land through the Mediterranean sea as they flee their country at war ...

Some of these boats were gone in the night from Tuesday to Wednesday in the Turkish coastal town of Bodrum to the Greek island of Kos, one of the short sea crossings between Turkey and Europe, when capsized, explained the Turkish coastguard.

Quickly warned by the cries of survivors, rescuers have recovered 12 dead bodies including that of Aylan Kurdi, aged 3 years and whose brother, Galip, 5, also perished in the sinking, according to Turkish media. Photos of the two brothers and the corpse of Aylan, shirt red and blue shorts, face against the ground, on the beaches of the resort of Bodrum has invaded social networks under the word-pound #KiyiyaVuranInsanlik ("the humanity failed "in Turkish), which became one of the most shared-sharp word on Twitter.-----Source: With Agencies
