In Kumi Naidoo, Greenpeace International Director of "The COP21 can be an opportunity for world leaders to make it safer. It is also an opportunity to accelerate energy transition already underway. Renewables are already exceed the dirty and dangerous energy in the world. The question is whether in this race Paris will be a real accelerator."

WHAT CAN WE EXPECT FROM COP21 ?------

We know we can not expect everything from the conference: the COP21, to be up to the challenge, should lead to an agreement to contain the increase of temperatures 1.5 ° C and avoid dangerous runaway climate change.

This would result in the adoption of a long-term goal of 100% renewable energy, avoiding false solutions such as nuclear. What differentiates the Paris conference of the previous COP is that it takes place at a time when renewable energy is booming. In OECD countries, 80% of electricity production capacity will be added to the network by 2020 will be from renewable sources. Greenpeace has observer status in the COP, and a delegation made up of different nationalities, including Chinese, Indian, American, will be present at Le Bourget and will follow the negotiations, the two weeks of the COP.
