Arrested an American couple who lives with his dead son from a month ago

USPA NEWS - An African American marriage of US nationality and age in their thirties has been arrested in Girona, a city of extreme northeastern Spain, on charges of reckless homicide. They lived with the corpse of her seven years.

The child's body was discovered by Police after the owners of the apartment, after going to the house to collect rent, denounced seeing strange things. The officers entered the house and found the body lying in the bed of one of the bedrooms, in an advanced state of decomposition, but no visible signs of violence. The child's parents, aged around 30 years and African Americans with US passports, were arrested and Friday will spend to Justice.

Police are trying to find an explanation to the fact that marriage coexisted for several weeks, probably a month, with the body of the child. The scene they found the Police who came to the house was described as macabre and trying to establish why the marriage did not report the death of his son and he started the paperwork to bury or cremate the body. According to neighbors of marriage and home owners are normal people who have never given reason to doubt their behavior.

The first hypothesis suggests that the child could die from a disease that was not treated. Two other children of the marriage, also children, have become protected by the Social Services of the regional Government of Catalonia. None of the three children was enrolled. Parents have been charged with reckless homicide, waiting to confirm the circumstances in which the events occurred.
